1. General Information about the 18th IUAES World Congress participants.

The 18th IUAES World Congress was held from 16 to 20 July 2018 in the city of Florianópolis, Santa Catarina, Brazil, at the campus of the Federal University at Santa Catarina. The congress was organized by the International Union of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences (IUAES) in partnership with the Brazilian Anthropology Association (ABA) and with the Federal University at Santa Catarina (UFSC). The principal theme of this edition of the IUAES World Congress was “World of Encounters: the past present and future of anthropological knowledge”. The congress had 3,080 people registered, 1,721 Brazilians and 1,359 foreigners. Of this total, 1,541 were present at the event, 1,053 Brazilians and 488 foreigners. The anthropologists who attended the 18th IUAES Congress came from 55 countries. Most of the participants, 61.1 % (1891), were women, and 38%, were men (1168). 1% of the participants were Trans people or did not identify . The congress had financial support from Brazil’s CNPq, the Wenner-Gren Foundation, CAPES and FAPESC. In addition to structural support from UFSC, UDESC, and IFSC, partners in the event organization included the World Anthropological Union, the World Council of Anthropological Associations, the Instituto Federal de Santa Catarina and the State University of Santa Catarina.

Chart 1. Gender Sort

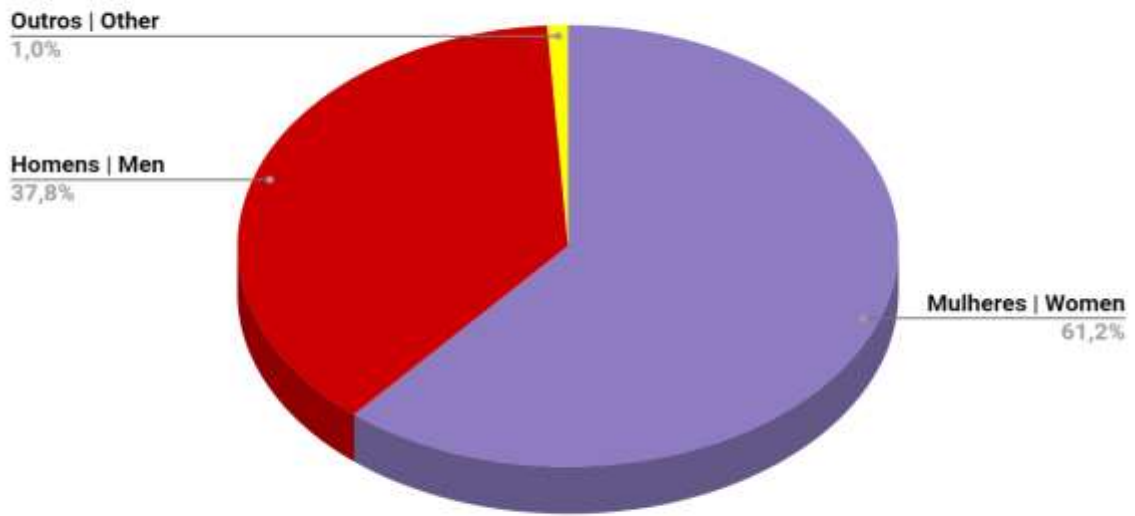


Chart 2. Age Range of Participants

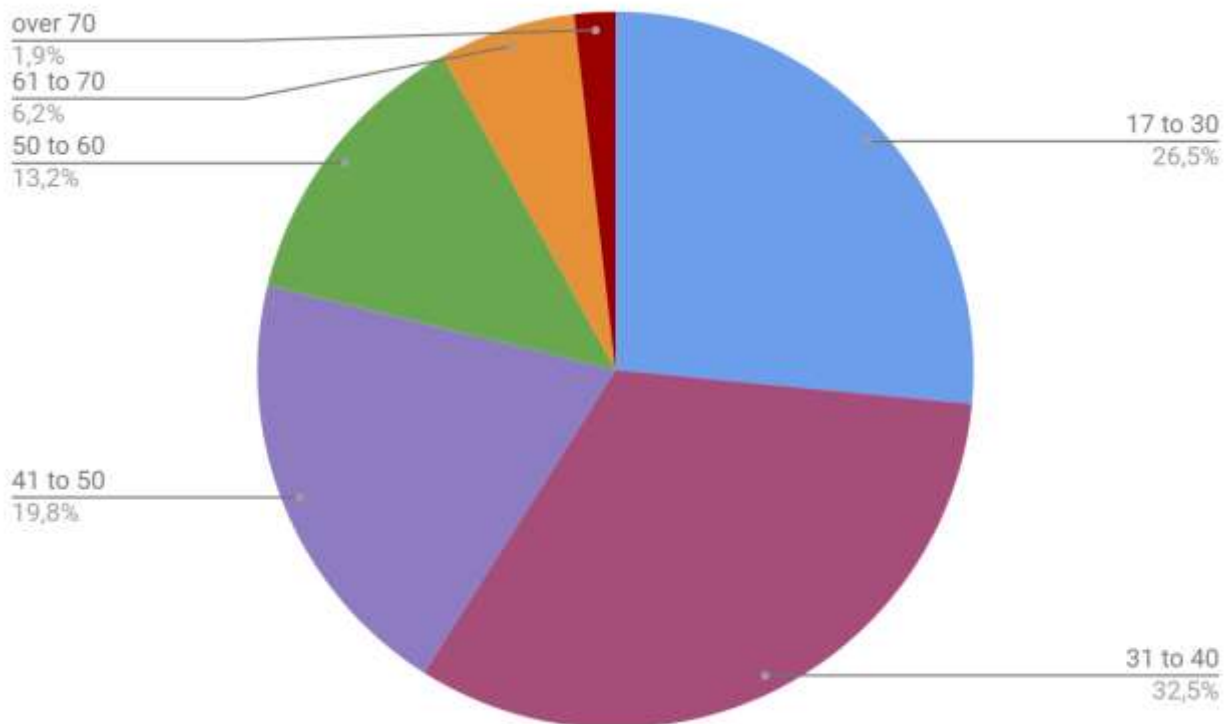

2. FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS

2.1. Revenue Source

The congress coordination has submitted several projects for financing agencies such as: FAPESC (Foundation for Support to Research and Innovation of Santa Catarina); CAPES (Coordination of Improvement of Higher Level Personnel), CNPq (National Council for Scientific and Technological Development), Wenner-Gren Foundation, we have also received financial compensation from the University Press, the Pro-Rector of Extension and Pro-Rector of Graduate Studies, Secretary of Culture and Art, PPGICH of the Federal University of Santa Catarina, through agreements signed with the institution and the Organizing Committee.

The conversion from Brazilian Reais to US dollars follows the approximate exchange rates for the 25th of January 2019 of R \$ 3.77 reais per US dollar. Only the US \$ 20,000 Amount funded by the Wenner Gren Foundation follows the deposit date rates in our account (07/03/2018) plus the amounts paid as Tax on Financial Operations IOF. For conference / audit purposes, please consider amounts in reais.

2.2. Federal University of Santa Catarina Financial Counterpart:

In addition to these revenues, we consider it important to highlight that UFSC contributed with scholarships to the students who worked at the organization of the congress, besides the exemption of amounts usually charged for the use of the university's physical space. These two sources of assets are not monetary values managed by the organizers of the congress, but rather from the Federal University of Santa Catarina's own income invested in the training of students who could participate in the congress as trainees

and members of organizing committees. In addition to these two forms of counterpart, UFSC also made R \$ 5,000.00 available through the Secretary of Art and Culture, R \$ 4,600.00 in credit in the university press and R \$ 2,000.00 in the Interdisciplinary Graduate Program in Social Sciences Human. The latter three were included in the table 8 "Expenses Nature"

2.3. Some observations about the expenses made at the 18th IUAES World Congress

We chose to prioritize expenses with plane - tickets, lodging, meals and transportation that could benefit the largest number of participants and promote social and cultural inclusion.

Food and lodging were offered to guests such as Keynotes, ABA and IUAES board and Plenary and Symposium participants, benefiting 116 congress members.

To benefit the highest number of participants from countries of the global south, two public bids for financing for food and lodging were issued. One bid was aimed at foreign researchers, specifically from countries of the global south, particularly Latin America, Asia, Africa and Oceania. It was offered to undergraduate and graduate anthropology students, recent Ph.D. recipients, researchers who participated for the first time in an IUAES congress and for retired professors and researchers or professors emeritus with reduced income. The other public bid was aimed at Brazilian students or students resident in Brazil, who are black or indigenous, who are registered graduate or undergraduate students in anthropology, the social sciences or related fields and who entered their course under the system of ethnic-racial affirmative action.

Together, the two calls for funding included 81 people with lodging, food and commuting.

Free meals were offered during the congress at UFSC's university restaurant to congress monitors, Native peoples, the organizing commission and to people who presented work at the open panels. A total of approximately 1,500 meals were provided to congress

participants at the university restaurant, including 500 meals for students who worked as monitors at the congress, 500 for beneficiaries of the public bids for financial support and 500 from Native and ethnic-minority groups.

Furthermore free bus lines were made available commuting between the airport and the university, and between the university and the hotels.

The financial data described in the tables above do not mention exemption from enrollment of students who made themselves available to work as monitors and / or have been part of the organizing committee. In total, delegate monitors and / or members of the organizing committee were exempted from registration.

As a counterpart, the organization of the congress, with the support from the ABA, made the decision to exempt the registration costs for the Native and ethnic-minority population who wanted to participate in the congress. Data about these researchers are in annex III. There were 78 participants in the congress from this category, including representatives of Brazilian indigenous peoples, Roma and Chinese indigenous peoples.

This risky financial decision aimed to promote ethnic and social inclusion of young researchers, as well as contribute to the students' training process, giving them a unique professional experience in their role as monitors and organizers of the 18th IUAES World Congress.
